

## STATEMENT OF GENERAL HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

- maintains and develops safe systems of work for all employees;
- aims to minimise accident rates;
- and, periodically reviews this policy and procedures to ensure that best health and safety management practices are adopted.

Forest managers and supervisors have key health and safety responsibilities acting as the main link between senior management and operatives in the workplace.

All employees have legislative obligations to take reasonable care for health, safety and welfare of themselves and of other persons who may be affected by their acts or omissions. Every person working on behalf of Fountains Forestry is responsible for ensuring safe process and practice.
