Background Information

Purpose of the Job

The placement will provide you with hands-on experience in managing forestry and woodland creation projects. You will develop a working knowledge in a wide range of woodland management and environmental issues in relation to the delivery of Scottish Government policies and the Scottish Forestry Strategy.

You will be provided with an individual learning plan and receive support from a designated manager locally and through our Learning & Development Team.

The key responsibilities for the role will include:

Your role will include, but not be limited to:

- Assisting the forest managers in managing our forest properties, harvesting programmes and replanting works.

- Helping with grant applications including new planting, forest plans and felling licences;
- Supervising new planting, restocking and maintenance works.
- Undertaking site inspections to assess stocking densities, pests and diseases, soil surveys
- Developing your skills as a potential forest manager

Key skills, experience and qualifications

You will currently be in further or higher education, studying towards a forestry, environmental or land-based management discipline, and ideally have a working knowledge of Geographic Information Systems (GIS);

You should have map reading skills with the ability to navigate in remote areas, be equipped with good organisational skills, patience and an eye for detail, and ideally have previous experience of forest management operations.

We would expect you to have a full UK driving licence.
